Ports of Call

GEORGE TOWN, GRAND CAYMAN

The island of Grand Cayman is a haven for nature lovers and divers. Perhaps swim and snorkel with stingrays, see the underwater world from a semi-submersible sub, send a postcard from “Hell,” visit a turtle farm where green sea turtles are raised, or just relax on miles and miles of exquisite white sand beach.

COZUMEL, MEXICO

Cozumel is an island in the Caribbean Sea off the east coast of Mexico’s Yucatan Peninsula. Enjoy a day snorkeling, diving to fabulous reefs, or exploring the jungle with an ATV. Relax beside the pool at a beach club, stroll a vast beach, or visit an ancient Mayan temple.

BELIZE CITY, BELIZE

Be sure to visit the beautifully restored temples and plazas of Cahal Pech, a major Mayan site on a hilltop, or explore Belize City and its museum filled with Mayan artifacts. Journey along the Olde Belize River and watch for howler monkeys, alligators, and iguanas en route to Altun Ha. Or head for the stunning Barrier Reef to dive or snorkel in crystalline waters.

SANTO TOMAS, GUATEMALA

Take in the archaeological site of Quiriguá and its stunning Mayan stelae. Perhaps enjoy a boat ride along the Rio Dulce to Lake Izabal past riverside Mayan villages, lush tropical vegetation, and Fort San Felipe. Or take a short flight to Flores for an unforgettable visit to incredible, mysterious Tikal, whose soaring ancient temples rise from the jungle floor.

ROATAN, HONDURAS

The largest of the Bay Islands, Roatan lies just over 30 miles from the north coast of the Honduran mainland. Luxuriate on the magnificent beaches, snorkel, or dive and explore the superb shallow reefs. Consider a horseback ride along the beach and through a tropical forest for a unique way to see the island’s other natural wonders.

PUERTO LIMON, COSTA RICA

The city of Puerto Limon is a gateway to Costa Rica’s topical splendor. Consider a ride on an aerial tram through the rainforest canopy at Braulio Carillo National Park. For a different perspective take a boat ride through the Tortuguero Canals or the Estero Negro Estuary, the rich jungle tapestry all around while watching for colorful birds, monkeys, iguanas, sloths, crocodiles, and the legendary iridescent Blue Morpho butterfly.

FUERTE AMADOR (BALBOA), PANAMA

One of the entrances to the Panama Canal on the Pacific side, the port of Fuerte Amador, founded in 1519, is a short drive from Panama City. Explore the beautiful French and Spanish colonial homes in Panama City’s Casco Viejo, marvel at Panama’s lush rainforest, or visit a secluded Indian village.

QUITO (MANTA), ECUADOR

As a gateway to Ecuador, the small port city of Manta is a short drive from Montecristi, where the world’s best Panama hats are produced and where they originated. Catch a flight to the capital city of Quito, a wonderfully preserved colonial-era city perched 9,200 feet above sea level. Beautiful lakes, volcanoes, and high mountains around the town of Otavalo are spectacular.

GUAYAQUIL, ECUADOR

The largest city and main port of Ecuador, Guayaquil has become one of the most sought after tourist destinations. Enjoy a long walk along the riverfront, where shopping and sightseeing go hand in hand thanks to the numerous malls, parks and historical monuments. Take a flight to the Galapagos Islands or an excursion to the Cerro Blanco Forest Reserve if you’re looking for beautiful flora and rare wildlife.

SALAVERRY, PERU

Founded by the Spanish conquistador Pizarro, Salaverry has numerous archaeological excavations to explore. It is also a jumping off spot for a visit to Trujillo, a city surrounded by pre-Incan archeological sites, and the largest pre-Columbian city in South America, Chan Chan, a UNESCO Archaeological World Heritage Site.

LIMA/MACHU PICCHU (CALLAO), PERU

The “Lost City of the Incas” is South America’s most intriguing archaeological site. Discovered in 1911 by Hiram Bingham, Machu Picchu is perched 7,875 feet above sea level and has a 1,800-foot vertical drop. What remains are extraordinary stone buildings built by the Incas for use as temples, sanctuaries, homes, and water fountains. This UNESCO World Heritage site was originally built in 1460. Also enchanting is the colonial city of Cuzco, with its majestic Plaza de Armas and the ancient Incan fortress of Sacsayhuaman.

Shore excursions are not included. In each port of call you may select from a variety of optional shore excursions for an additional charge, some of which are referenced in the descriptions above.
